MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE SARATOGA TOWN COUNCIL HELD NOVEMBER 21, 2017 AT 6:00 P.M. IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBERS OF THE SARATOGA TOWN HALL

Mayor Ed Glode called the meeting to order at 6 p.m.

Members present were Councilman Steven Wilcoxson, Councilwoman Jennie Lou Garland and Mayor Glode. Councilman Will Faust and Councilman Richard Raymer were absent from the meeting.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA: Councilman Wilcoxson made a motion to approve the Agenda as presented. Councilwoman Garland seconded and the motion carried.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES: Councilwoman Garland made a motion to approve the minutes of the November 7, 2017 meeting as presented. Councilman Wilcoxson seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

APPROVAL OF THE BILLS: Treasurer Sammy Flohr read the following bills for approval: Accounts Payable: \$144,306.28; Payroll and FICA for pay period 11/13/2017 in the amount of \$55,264.09; and manual checks in the amount of \$504.92 for a total of \$200,075.29.

Councilman Wilcoxson made a motion to pay the bills as presented in the amount of \$200,075.29. Councilwoman Garland seconded and the motion carried.

CORRESPONDENCE: Mayor Glode read an email that he received electronically commending the town hall staff for their helpfulness. Assistant Clerk Treasurer Brenda Mistelske and Clerk Suzie Cox were thanked for assisting the visiting individual with kindness and professionalism.

ITEMS FROM THE PUBLIC: Steve Heintz addressed the council with his opinion about how past and present projects have been done by the town, with comments about lack of oversight, bidding processes, etc. Mr. Heintz then read an internal confidential memo intended for the Council and Mayor from Clerk Cox.

REPORTS FROM DEPARTMENTS: *Town Hall:* Mayor Glode reported that the public hearing for the liquor license renewals was held prior to the council meeting. Mayor Glode noted that all applications for renewal had been completed, publication requirements were met and all fees paid.

Councilwoman Garland made a motion to approve the Limited Retail (Club) Liquor License renewal for the American Legion. Councilman Wilcoxson seconded and the motion carried.

Councilman Wilcoxson made a motion to approve the Bar & Grill Liquor License renewal for Bella's Bistro. Councilwoman Garland seconded and the motion carried.

Councilwoman Garland made a motion to approve the Retail Liquor License renewal for Duke's Bar and Grill. Councilman Wilcoxson seconded and the motion carried.

The policy would allow the senior official in the police department to enact and update policies as needed to meet the needs of the Saratoga Police Department.

Request for Reimbursement #2 for State project# ASAA13B in the amount of \$22,846.08 and Federal project #3-56-0026-26 in the amount of \$342,691.20 is for crushing and stockpiling material for the upcoming project. The town's share of this portion of the project will be \$15,130.72 and requires permission for the Mayor to sign.

Spring Street, Saratoga, Wyoming), until 10:00 A.M., January 26, 2018. At such time, Bids received will be publicly opened and read aloud.

Plans, specifications, and bid forms will be distributed electronically. Plans can be downloaded at www.elementengineering.net under "Project Bidding" and will be available on December 22, 2017 at 10:00 AM. The charge for plans is \$10.00. A non-mandatory pre-bid conference will be held at the Saratoga Town Hall on January 5, 2018 at 10:00 A.M. with a site visit to follow.

Bids shall be made on the forms furnished by the Owner and shall be enclosed in a sealed envelope and endorsed with the name of the Bidder. All bids must be accompanied by a bid security in an amount of at least 5% of the Bid, in the form of a bid bond. The bond will be retained by the Owner if the successful bidder refuses or fails to enter into a contract with the Owner. Bids shall be valid for ninety (90) consecutive calendar days from the bid date.

The project consists of various improvements to the town's wastewater treatment facility including installation of an influent

flow meter and various valves and fittings, construction of a new force main, air piping, diffused air control system, chlorination and de-chlorination facilities, lab building and pole barn, floating pond cover system, and septic receiving station.

Zoning Resolution Amendment (ZRA) Case #2018-01: In accordance with Section 6.8, of the Carbon County Zoning Resolution, Amendments to the Zoning Resolution and Zoning District/Map Amendments, the Carbon County Planning and Zoning Commission shall prepare recommendations to effectuate the Planning and Zoning purposes and certify its recommendations to the Board of County Commissioners. The Carbon County Planning and Zoning Commission will consider the following summary of the proposed amendments to the text of the Zoning Resolution:

Chapter 5-General Regulations Applying to all Districts and Uses.
Section 5.1-Supplementary Regulations:
Add-Part H. Transmission Lines. Overhead electrical transmission lines over 69,000 volts are only allowed by conditional use permits in all zones. Building permits are required prior to construction.

Chapter 4-Zone District Regulations.
Section 4.4-Ranching, Agriculture and Mining (RAM) Zone District:

A. Principally Permitted Uses:
Add-Meteorological (MET) Tower with tower height being less than 300 feet.
Section 4.8-Neighborhood Commercial (C-1) Zone District:
A. Principally Permitted Uses:
