This facility will cease disposal of solid waste. The 40-acre facility is located approximately 1.5 miles east of the incorporated Town of Saratoga. More specifically, this facility is located in the SW1/4 SW1/4 of Section 8, T17N, R83W, in Carbon County, Wyoming.

The Department of Environmental Quality, Solid and Hazardous Waste Division (DEQ) has reviewed the application and determined that it is generally complete and suitable for publication. The DEQ's solid waste rules, in Chapter 1, require that the applicant must provide public notice that a proposed permit has been issued and inform the public that there is an opportunity to file comments on the proposed permit before it is issued in final form. The notice is also required to indicate that the public may file formal written objections to issuance of a final permit. This publication provides notice of those opportunities.

If substantial written objections are filed, a contested case hearing will be held by the Environmental Quality Council.

In accordance with the provisions of the Wyoming Environmental Quality Act and Chapter 1 of the Solid Waste Rules and Regulations, the Upper Platte River Solid Waste Disposal District has submitted a new permit application for the Saratoga Construction & Demolition Landfill.

This facility provides for the disposal of construction and demolition wastes which have been generated within the Upper Platte River Solid Waste Disposal District. The 30-acre facility is located approximately one and three quarter's miles east of the incorporated Town of Saratoga. More specifically, this facility is located in the SE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 8, T17N, R83W, in Carbon County, Wyoming. The total volumetric capacity of this facility is estimated to be 496,390 cubic yards. The life of the facility is estimated to be 40 years.

The Department of Environmental Quality, Solid and Hazardous Waste Division (DEQ) has reviewed the application and determined that it is generally complete and suitable for publication. The DEQ's solid waste rules, in Chapter 1, require that the applicant must provide public notice that a proposed permit has been issued and inform the public that there is an opportunity to file comments on the proposed permit before it is issued in final form. Notice of Request for a Permit and Hearing Filing Information Before the Wyoming Industrial Siting Council Docket Number DEQ/ISC 12-10 Gateway West Transmission Line Project

Notice of Request for a Permit

Pursuant to provisions of the Wyoming Industrial Development Information and Siting Act and Siting Rules and Regulations, Notice is hereby given that Rocky Mountain Power (Applicant) filed an application for a Permit to construct and operate the Gateway West Transmission Line Project in Carbon County and Sweetwater County. The applicant proposes to construct and operate a total of 191.4 miles of 500-kilovolt (kV), 230-kV, and 345-kV alternating Current (AC) electric transmission lines and associated substation facilities as part of their Energy Vision 2020 plan. The 500-kV/345-kV portion of the project begins in Carbon County 20 miles northeast of the Town of Hanna, heading west passing just north of Hanna. It then continues along the I-80 corridor to the west from Sinclair to Point of Rocks, Wyoming into Sweetwater County and eventually terminates at the existing Jim Bridger Substation near Superior. The 230-kV portion of the project is located entirely in Carbon County and begins approximately 10 miles northwest of Medicine Bow and heads southwest terminating immediately southeast of the town of Hanna. The proposed project crosses 101.8 miles of private land, 74.3 miles of BLM-managed land, and 14.7 miles of State land, and 0.7 miles of water body crossings. Construction is anticipated to commence in Q2 2019 and be completed by Q3 2020. Construction manpower is anticipated to average 325 workers over the duration of the construction period from April 2019 through October 2020 and peak at 511 workers in October 2019. The hearing on this matter is anticipated on October 25, 2018 in Rawlins, Wyoming. PROPOSED DISCHARGE OF DREDGED OR FILL MATERIAL TO THE NORTH PLATTE RIVER

The Wyoming Department of Environmental Quality (WDEQ) has received a request from the United States Department of Agriculture-Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) on behalf of Ryan Ranches, Inc. for State certification of U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Nationwide Permit #27, for discharge of dredged or fill material along the North Platte River for purposes of stream bank stabilization/rehabilitation, south of Saratoga, Wyoming. The North Platte River from the confluence with Sage Creek upstream to the Colorado/Wyoming state line is designated Class 1. Point source discharges to Class 1 waters are prohibited except for storm water and construction related discharges. This certification will require meeting the provisions in Chapter 1, Section 7(b) of the WDEQ Water Quality Rules and Regulations, which allows these discharges under certain circumstances.

Proposed activities within a 1,500-foot reach of the North Platte River include re-distribution of bed material to create a stable channel, construct 600-feet of bank full bench and integrate 550-foot of toe-wood revetment. Four rock vanes would also be installed to further promote stream bank stability. Woody riparian vegetation would be planted in the project area to provide additional stability for the rock vanes and toe-wood. Approximately 1,000 cubic yards (CY) of rock would be required for the rock vanes.

The two men informed the officers that they had been shooting three different rifles: an SKS, a .22 and a 9mm. Drumm and Stillely informed the officers that they had been using the roof of Stillely's vehicle as a shooting rest and were shooting south into a stack of logs.

It was while shooting into

this stack of logs, which the affidavit described as being stacked in a pyramid shape approximately 10 feet tall, 30 feet deep and 60 feet wide that the house of Anthony and Mackenzie Rakness was struck. The Rakness residence, according to Moore's affidavit, was three-tenths of a mile behind the log pile the two men

were shooting into.

M. Rakness was home at the time with her son making lunch when the shots began. Hearing the shots, Rakness retrieved the family dog from outside and resumed her activities. While standing in the middle of the kitchen, Rakness reported to Moore that she was struck in the leg. Rakness re-

trieved her son from the child seat he had been sitting on and sought cover behind a wall.

Rakness was discovered by her husband and father-in-law and was transported to Ivinson Memorial Hospital in Laramie. The bullet that struck Rakness was, according to the affidavit, lodged in her lower right femur and caused damage to the joint.

Three screws were required to fix the break.

Drumm and Stillely are both currently being held on a \$100,000 cash only bond. If convicted, both men could face up to 51 years in prison and a fine of up to \$30,000. responded from Medicine Bow. Due to the distance
