Public Notice Review of Power Company of Wyoming LLC's request to Amend Permit DEQ/ISC 12-07 Wyoming Department of Environmental Quality, Wyoming Industrial Siting Council

Notice is hereby given that the Industrial Siting Division received an amendment request on January 3, 2019 from Power Company of Wyoming LLC (Permittee). The Permittee is seeking approval to amend its construction schedule for the Chokecherry and Sierra Madre Wind Energy Project in Carbon County. The Permittee's request changes the duration of construction from 8 years (2016 to 2023) to 11 years (2016 to 2026). The estimated peak construction workforce is decreased from 945 occurring in 2019 to 715 occurring in 2026. The information submitted includes a letter describing the request, updated Figures and Tables for construction sequencing, estimated total construction workforce, as well as monthly peak workforce. The Director of the Department of Environmental Quality intends to approve the request.

Pursuant to Permit Condition #11, the Administrator is providing public notice of the requested change to permit DEQ/ISC 12-07. MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE SARATOGA TOWN COUNCIL HELD JANUARY 2, 2019 AT 6:00 P.M. IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBERS OF THE SARATOGA TOWN HALL

Mayor Ed Glode called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Members present were Mayor Glode, Councilman Steve Wilcoxson and Councilman Richard Raymer. Councilman Will Faust was absent from the meeting.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA: Councilman Raymer made a motion to approve the Agenda as presented. Councilman Wilcoxson seconded and the motion carried.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES: Councilman Raymer made a motion to approve the minutes of the December 18, 2018 meeting as presented. Councilman Wilcoxson seconded and the motion carried.

APPROVAL OF THE BILLS: Treasurer Samuel Flohr read the following bills for approval: Accounts Payable: \$18,836.27; Payroll and FICA for 12/26/18 in the amount of \$56,049.57; and manual checks in the amount of \$46,892.54, for a total of \$121,778.38.

Councilman Wilcoxson

made a motion to pay the bills in the amount of \$121,778.38. Councilman Raymer seconded and the motion carried.

REPORTS FROM DEPARTMENTS

Town Hall: Mayor Ed J. Glode gave the Oath of Office to newly elected Mayor John Zeiger, newly elected Councilman Bob Keel and newly elected Councilman Jon Nelson. Following the Oath of Office the new Mayor and Councilmen joined Councilman Steve Wilcoxson.

Mayor Zeiger asked the council for a motion to designate the Rawlins National Bank, the Bank of Commerce and the Bank of the West as the official depositories.

Councilman Keel made a motion to designate the Rawlins National Bank, the Bank of Commerce and the Bank of the West as an official depository of the Town of Saratoga, seconded by Councilman Wilcoxson and the motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Zeiger asked the council to designate the Saratoga Sun and the Rawlins Times as the designated newspapers.

Councilman Nelson made a motion to designate the Saratoga Sun and the Rawlins Times as the official newspaper of the Town of Saratoga, seconded by Councilman Keel and the motion passed unanimously.

Mayor Zeiger read Resolution 2019-02 – a resolution approving the proposition for imposition of a 1% Specific Sales and Use Tax to be placed on the ballot at an election to be held on May 7, 2019.

INSURANCE

Checklist for the New Year

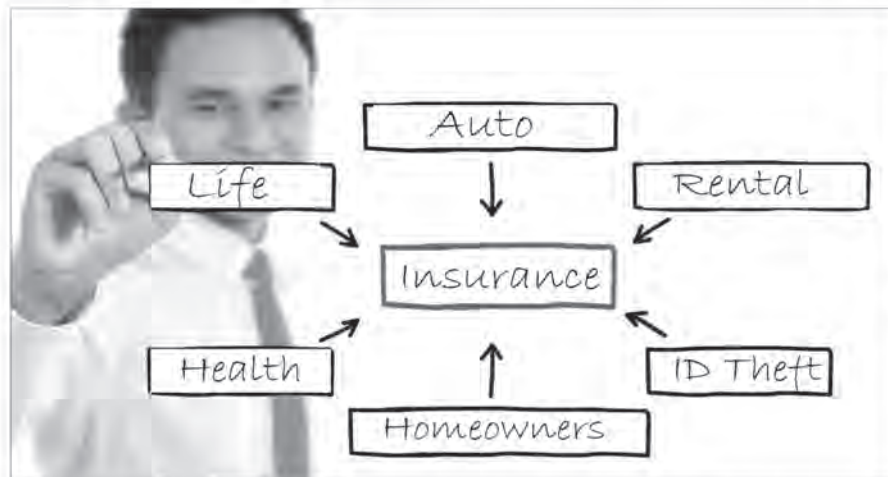
Make a resolution to review your insurance policies and coverage. The start of a new year is a great time to reevaluate your insurance coverage needs. Talk with your agent and review your policies to see if they meet your current needs.

Life Insurance

Changes – such as a birth, divorce, remarriage or even a new mortgage or new job – are indicators that you might need to make changes to your life insurance policy. Read your policy carefully and answer these questions:

- Do premiums or benefits vary from year to year?
- Do the total benefits grow over time?
- Are there benefits that are not guaranteed?
- Do premiums change over time?
- What happens if I quit paying premiums – do I maintain some of the benefits?
- Are there any impacts associated with interest earned on the policy?
- In what situations and through what procedures can you assess cash values?
- Can the policy be converted into another form of insurance or annuity?

Events like paying off your mortgage, retirement or children finishing college might mean that you can lower your life insurance coverage and premiums. Ask whether you have the option of "conversion privileges" from your current term life insurance policy to a new whole



life policy. You may also be able to expand your death benefits to be used while you are still living.

Homeowners/Rental

This past year we saw a significant number of natural disasters including floods, earthquakes and wildfires. Disasters can be costly, and may not be covered under a standard policy. Discuss adding coverage for these perils.

Update your home inventory and make sure your homeowners or rental policy is up-to-date. Take photos or video of your prized possessions. Note valuable antiques, artwork or jewelry. Creating a home inventory from the NAIC's free smartphone app, myHOME Scr. APP.book, Download the app from iTunes or Google Play.

Add any new, expensive gifts to your inventory. Include as many details as you can and take photos of each item. Most basic home insurance policies have standard limits for big-ticket items like electronics, art, jewelry or sporting equipment

so you may need special coverage.

Auto Insurance

- Makesureyourcoverageis appropriate for your life situation. If your liability insurance is too low, you may be legally exposed for any damages above your liability limits.
- Review your deductibles for comprehensive and collision coverage -- the amount you will pay if your car is damaged or totaled without fault of another driver.
- Have a copy of your insurance card and insurance agent or company's number in your vehicle at all times.
- Accurately record details of an accident if you are in one. The smartphone applications such as WreckCheck assist you through the process.

Health Insurance

You may have recently enrolled or changed your health insurance through your employer or Medicare. Make sure you have new insurance cards and paperwork before you visit a doctor.

- Check your provider lists to make sure visits to your doctor and any specialists are still covered, as in-network or preferred provider lists change from year to year.
- Read through your documents and make note of co-pays for in-network and out-of-network providers to avoid surprises.
- Identify urgent care centers and hospitals that accept your insurance coverage. Ask about applicable co-pays and deductibles.

Protect Yourself from Identity Theft and Fraudulent Activity

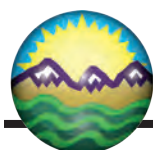
A data breach can potentially expose a consumer's data putting you at risk for identity theft or other fraudulent activity. Protect your identity by following these tips:

- Never give out any personal information – like your social security number or bank information – over the phone.
- Consider purchasing identity theft insurance.
- When purchasing an insurance policy:
 - Research the agent and company you're considering. Before writing your check or signing the contract, call the Wyoming Department of Insurance to verify they are licensed in Wyoming.
 - Ask for copies of everything you sign and keep a copy of the initial policy payment receipt or check you gave the agent or company.
 - Call the insurance company if you don't receive a copy of the insurance policy outlining your coverage and its limitations within 30 days of your purchase.
