A regular meeting of the Board of Carbon County Commissioners (BOCC) commenced Tuesday, December 21, 2021, at 9:00 a.m. at the Carbon Building – Courthouse Annex, Rawlins, WY. Attending the meeting were Chairman, John Johnson, Vice Chairman, Sue Jones, John Espy, Byron Barkhurst and Travis Moore. Chairman Johnson called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

### ADDITIONS / CORRECTIONS

Chairman Johnson added a discussion about a rescue truck under the Fire Warden.

### CONSENT AGENDA

Commissioner Espy moved to approve the consent agenda noting any item could be removed for separate action. The consent agenda includes the December 7, 2021, regular meeting minutes; monthly receipts from the Clerk of District Court in the amount of \$3,618.70, a bond for Doreen Harvey, Clerk/Treasurer for the Town of Encampment in the amount of \$75,000.00. Commissioner Moore seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

### ELECTED OFFICIALS & DEPARTMENT HEADS

#### Fire

Commissioner Espy moved to waive the procurement policy and authorized the purchase of a used GMC rescue truck, diesel with approximately 100,000 miles totaling \$30,000 using the Strike Team fund. Commissioner Moore seconded and Commissioner Barkhurst asked the value of the hydraulic tools that come with the truck. Mr. Rutherford said approximately \$15,000, about half the purchase price. Mr. Rutherford also confirmed for Commissioner Moore that Hanna is typically sending two trucks to a scene but having this truck would allow for only one to be sent. The motion carried unanimously.

#### Emergency Management

Commissioner Jones moved to approve the Chairman's signature on the Grant Award Agreement between the Wyoming Office of Homeland Security and Carbon County

for construction of the RR 316 Hanna Mitigation Living Fence Project for a term of September 5, 2020, through March 31, 2024, in an amount not to exceed \$24,843.75. Commissioner Barkhurst seconded, and the motion passed unanimously. Commissioner Barkhurst moved to approve the Chairman's signature on the Memorandum of Understanding between the City of Rawlins Police Department Emergency Communications Center and Carbon County Office of Emergency Management (Carbon County Coordination Center (C4)). Commissioner Espy seconded, and the motion passed unanimously. Commissioner Moore moved to approve the Board of Carbon County Commissioners Preparedness Cooperative Agreement pending legal review. Commissioner Barkhurst seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

### Road & Bridge

Commissioner Jones moved to approve FY2022 Congestion Mitigation Air Quality (CMAQ) CM22101 totaling \$330,000 including a county match of \$66,000 from the county road fund and a Federal Match of \$264,000 for 55 miles mag chloride on County Roads 500 and 291. Commissioner Espy seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

### Clerk

Commissioner Espy moved to appoint Jenna L. Larson to the Carbon County Weed and Pest Control for the Baggs Area V for an unexpired 4-year term ending January 2023 and to reappoint Todd Kaisler to the Carbon County Fair Board for a 5-year term ending November 2026. Commissioner Barkhurst seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Jones moved to designate the Saratoga Sun as the Carbon County Newspaper of Record (official publication) for a term of one year beginning January 1, 2022, through December 31, 2022, at a rate of \$5.94. Commissioner Barkhurst seconded and stated his thoughts prior to knowing pricing was the subscriber numbers. The motion passed unanimously.

### EXECUTIVE SESSION

Commissioner Espy moved to go into executive session at 10:46 a.m. with Clerk Bartlett and Ashley Mayfield Davis to discuss personnel, potential litigation and other matters considered confidential by law. Commissioner Moore seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Espy moved to come out of executive session at 11:40 a.m. noting no action was taken and that the minutes be signed and sealed. Commissioner Moore seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

### ADJOURNMENT

Commissioner Espy moved to adjourn the meeting at 11:41 a.m. Commissioner Moore seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

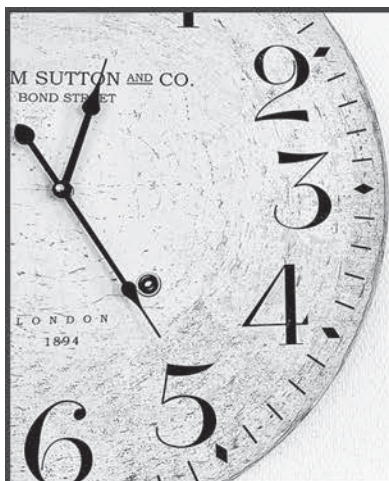

### COUNCIL COMMENTS

### ITEMS FROM THE PUBLIC

Nick Haderlie - Aquatics Center - Nick Haderlie is the President of the free youth martial arts program in the valley. He has raised enough money to do a feasibility study for an aquatics center and will put together a steering committee. The sites they are considering are owned by the town of Saratoga. A community survey will go out in January and the architecture firm will tentatively come out on January 14, 2022.

Amanda Knotwell - Ice Fishing Derby - January 15-16, 2022 - Councilman Nelson made the motion to approve the special events application contingent that department heads sign the application. Councilwoman Campbell seconded. Motion carried.

Amanda Knotwell stated that she will be replacing the current marquee with a color marquee. She will speak with the planning & zoning officer, Faren Stroh, about a current sign permit.

Josh Woods said that there may be redistricting at the legislative level will affect Carbon County. He wanted to let the council know so they could speak with a senator or house representative.

#### Town Hall:

Director Jon Winter received almost 33 tons of ice melt. He requested permission from the Council to purchase throughout the rest of the year. The ice melt is around \$4300 for 33 tons. Councilman Spaulding made a motion to purchase ice melt for approximately \$4300. Councilwoman Campbell seconded the motion. Motion carried.

#### Community Center Joint Powers Board:

#### Water and Sewer Joint Powers Board:

Councilman Nelson said the board recommended to proceed with the first of several specific purpose tax projects. Councilman Nelson stated the Town need an RFP to get

designs for the first project. Councilman Nelson also spoke about drafting an ordinance for disconnecting a water & sewer account. The next meeting is on January 12, 2022 6pm at the PVCC following the workshop starting at 4:30pm.

### Planning Commission:

There will be 2 public hearings at the next meeting. One is Gary Ervin's preliminary plat hearing and the other is Roger Fittje's porch setback hearing. Next meeting is January 11, 2022 at 5:30pm at the Town Hall Council Chambers following the public hearing starting at 5:20pm.

### Saratoga Airport Advisory Board:

The airport board believes that with the pushback on the lift system, the right thing to do is find funding for the gravity sewer line. The airport board would also like to keep the FBO lease at the 5 year renewal period until more projects were done around the airport. Councilman Nelson made the motion to pay the invoice for Century Companies, Inc. Councilman Hutchins seconded the motion; motion carried.

### SCWEMS Board:

Clerk Marie Christen stated that the ambulance director, Stayton Mosbey, started on December 1, 2021 and he has submitted his report. SCWEMS will have a website to give the public our information and for easier access for people to sign up as volunteers. Stayton Mosbey has given the board reports to use as baseline numbers to compare with future reports to show how he can help change the service. The next meeting is January 17, 2022 at 6pm in Hanna.

### NEW BUSINESS

Councilman Spaulding stated that he and Mayor James walked through the new hospital to look at the construction progress. There is an August deadline for the hospital to be finished.
