A regular meeting of the Board of Carbon County Commissioners (BOCC) commenced Tuesday, August 2, 2022, at 9:00 a.m. at the Carbon Building-Courthouse Annex in Rawlins, WY. Attending the meeting were Chairman, John Johnson, Vice Chairman, Sue Jones, John Espy, Byron Barkhurst and Travis Moore. Chairman Johnson called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

ADDITIONS / CORRECTIONS

Chairman Johnson added a Resolution to approve a grant submission for South Central Wyoming Emergency Medical Service under the clerk and to add a bond for Karen Heath, Medicine Bow Clerk/Treasurer.

Commissioner Espy moved to approve the consent agenda noting any item could be removed for separate action. The consent agenda

includes the July 18, 2022, regular meeting minutes, monthly receipts from Planning Development totaling \$22,535.00 and Road & Bridge totaling \$100.00 and a bond for Karen Ruth Heath, Medicine Bow Clerk/Treasurer. Commissioner Moore seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

ELECTED OFFICIALS & DEPARTMENT HEADS

Emergency Management

Commissioner Barkhurst moved to authorize the Chairman's signature on the Grant Between WY Office of Homeland Security and Carbon County, 18-SHSP-CAR-HCE18 in the amount of \$13,000 for emergency area lighting at polling places. Commissioner Jones seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Jones moved to authorize the Chairman's signature on the Grant Between WY Office of Homeland Security and Carbon County, 18-SHSP-CAR-HEM18 in the amount of \$11,308.20 for site radios at the Memorial Hospital of Carbon County. Commissioner Espy seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Espy moved to authorize the Chairman's signature on Amendment One to the Grant Award Agreement Between the WY Office of Homeland Security and Carbon County for Grant 21-EMPG-ARP-CAR-GCF21 amending the total payment from \$20,000 to up to \$40,000.00 for reimbursement of volunteer hours as well as adding allowable training and travel expenses as authorized expenses with an extension through September 30, 2023. Commissioner Moore seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

IT

Commissioner Barkhurst moved to authorize the Chairman's signature on the Grant Between WY Office of Homeland Security and Carbon County, 21-SHSP-CAR-MU-CYB in the amount of \$37,648.00 for the purchase and installation of hardware and software for multi-factor authentication. Commissioner Espy seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Moore moved to authorize the Chairman's signature on the Amended Installation and Integration Agreement with Capital Business Systems for the lease of copiers. Commissioner Barkhurst seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Espy moved to authorize the Chairman's signature on the Interstate Cooperation Contract for the Texas Department of Information Resources Cooperative Contracts Program. Commissioner Moore seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Barkhurst moved to waive the procurement policy to purchase \$82,429.26 for network switches and associated equipment from Advanced Network Management from the general fund noting the waiver is because the company already has an agreement in place with the county for maintenance and support. Commissioner Espy seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

South Central WY Emergency Medical Service

Commissioner Jones moved to authorize the Chairman's signature on Resolution 2022-33, A Resolution Authorizing Submission of an ARPA Health and Human Services Grant Application to the Wyoming State Land & Investment Board on Behalf of South Central Wyoming Emergency Medical Services for the Purpose of Building and Constructing to Erect an Emergency Medical Services Station Facility in Hanna, Wyoming Purpose of Building and Construction. Commissioner Barkhurst seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Assessor

Commissioner Espy moved to adopt the 2022 Mill Levies as presented by the County Assessor. Commissioner Moore seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Road and Bridge

Commissioner Espy moved to close County Road 297 and install barriers except for emergency purposes as needed. Commissioner Jones seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Attorney

Commissioner Barkhurst moved to authorize the Chairman's signature on the Contract Between Wyoming Department of Family Services and Carbon County Board of County Commissioners in the amount of up to \$50,000 plus a \$7,500 in-kind match going through June 30, 2024, to fund the Community Juvenile Services Board. Commissioner Moore seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Clerk

Commissioner Espy moved to waive the procurement policy and purchase a Haglund from Tracked Outdoors in the amount of approximately \$160,000.00 using American Rescue Plan Funds, if the BOCC likes the Haglund once they see it; he added this will be a county asset under direction of the Sheriff's Department and their control and they will develop an operating policy for the unit. Commissioner Barkhurst seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Jones moved to authorize the Chairman's signature on Amendment Five to the Lease Between Wyoming Department of Transportation and Board of Carbon County Commissioners extending the lease through July 31, 2025, with the same fee due of \$1,200.00 per year. Commissioner Espy seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Jones moved to authorize the Chairman's signature on the Carbon County Prevention Project Subgrantee Contracts with Carbon County Higher Education Center in the amount of up to \$21,000 through June 30, 2024, and Memorial Hospital of Carbon County in the amount of up to \$4,000.00 through June 30, 2024, both to provide prevention services under the Prevention grant with the State of Wyoming. Commissioner Barkhurst seconded and the motion passed with all voting for the motion except Commissioner Moore who abstained due to conflict.

Commissioners

Commissioner Jones moved to ratify the Chairman's signature on the WY Airport Improvement Program Certificate of State Grant-in-Aid for the Dixon Airport Fence Relocation Project in the amount of \$34,533.00 state funds (6.00%) plus \$23,022.00 county funds (4.00%) and the remainder federal funds for FAA Project 3-56-0038-023-2022. Commissioner Barkhurst seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Jones moved to regretfully accept Stacey Finney's resignation from the upper Platte River Solid Waste Disposal District effective immediately and direct the Clerk to advertise the vacancy. Commissioner Barkhurst seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Commissioner Espy moved to go into executive session at 10:17 a.m. with Clerk Bartlett, Ashley Mayfield Davis and Sheriff Roybal to discuss personnel, potential litigation and other matters considered confidential by law. Commissioner Barkhurst seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Espy moved to come out of executive session at 10:49 a.m. noting no action was taken and that the minutes be signed and sealed. Commissioner Moore seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

CITIZEN & COMMISSIONERS DISCUSSION

Commissioner Moore authorized the Chairman's signature on a letter regarding a personnel matter. Commissioner Barkhurst seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

County Property For Sale

Commissioner Barkhurst moved to award bids for county owned property to the high bidder for parcel #1, (legal description) to Shawn Weaver in the amount of \$41,500.00. Commissioner Jones seconded and the motion passed with all voting for the motion except Commissioner Espy who abstained due to conflict.

Commissioner Jones moved to award bids for county owned property to the high bidder for each as follows all in the Skyline Acres Industrial Subdivision First Addition: Parcels 5, Lot 1 Block 6 and Parcel 11, Lot 4 Block 6 to Robert Weber and Parcel 9, Lot 3 Block 7 to Steve & D'La Shrove each at \$10,000.00 each. Commissioner Espy seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Espy moved to award bids for county owned property to the high bidder for each as follows, all in the Skyline Acres Industrial Subdivision First Addition: Parcels 6, 8, 10, 12, 13, 15, 16, 18 and 20, Lots 1-4 and 6-8 Block 8 along with portions of lots 1-4 Block 8 and Lot 4 Block 7 to John Curtis Pell and Veronica Pell in the amount of \$2,600 each; parcel 14, Lot 5 Block 8 to Barbara Linn in the amount of \$3,175.00; and parcel 7, Lot 2 Block 7 to Steve & D'La Shrove in the amount of \$5,000.00 and authorize any commissioner to sign all sales documents for all properties authorized at today's meeting. Commissioner Moore seconded and the motion passed with all voting in favor except Commissioner Moore who abstained.

Commissioner Espy moved to reject offers presented on parcels 2, 3, 4, 17 and 19, Lots 8-12 Block 3 of the Skyline Acres Industrial Subdivision. Commissioner Moore seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Planning & Development

Commissioner Barkhurst moved to accept the Certification of Recommended Action from the Planning & Zoning Commissioner concerning the following case file 2022-12, Thomas Garbutt-Benson's request for a zone change on .16 acres 13 miles west of Encampment off Highway 70 and schedule a public hearing September 6, 2022, at 11:15 a.m. at the Carbon Building – Courthouse Annex in Rawlins, WY. Commissioner Espy seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Public Hearing – 2022 Fee Schedule Amendments

Chairman Johnson opened a public hearing at 11:15 a.m. to hear proposed amendments to the Planning & Zoning Fee Schedule. Sarah Brugger, County Planning Director presented the amendments to the fee schedule and noted the Planning & Zoning Commissioner unanimously recommended approval of the changes.

Chairman Johnson called for comments for or against the case. There being no comments he closed the hearing at 11:20 a.m.

Commissioner Jones moved to approve 2022 Fee Schedule Amendments effective immediately and authorize the Chairman to sign Resolution 2022-34, A Resolution of the Board of County Commissioners of Carbon County, Wyoming, adopting the recommendation of the Carbon County Planning and Zoning Commission. "FEE SCHEDULE". Commissioner Espy seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

PUBLIC HEARING – C.U. Case 2015-04 – Sage Veterinary Services

Chairman Johnson opened a public hearing at 11:21 a.m. to hear C.U. Permit Transfer Requests for C.U. Case #2015-04 – Slater Creek Livestock, LLC/Benjamin, and Hallie Noland/Sage Veterinary Services request to approve the transfer of Conditional Use Permit Case File #2015-04 to Brown Horse Cattle Co., LLC and Baggs Veterinary Services, LLC. Planning Director Brugger overviewed the case file.

Chairman Johnson called for comments for or against the case. There being no comments, Chairman Johnson closed the hearing at 11:24 a.m.

Commissioner Barkhurst moved that based on the recommendation of the Planning & Zoning Commission and staff to approve Resolution No. 2022- 35 A Resolution of the Board of County Commissioners of Carbon County, Wyoming adopting the recommendation of the Carbon County Planning and Zoning Commission concerning C.U. Case #2015-04 – Slater Creek Livestock, LLC/Benjamin and Hallie Noland/Sage Veterinary Services request to approve the transfer of Conditional Use Permit Case File #2015-04 to Brown Horse Cattle Co., LLC and Baggs Veterinary Services, LLC. Commissioner Espy seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Espy moved to adjourn the meeting at 11:34 a.m. Commissioner Moore seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

**PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE WYOMING CONSTITUTION
TO BE VOTED ON AT THE GENERAL ELECTION NOV. 8, 2022**

Underlined words would be added to existing law. Words stricken through will be removed.

A JOINT RESOLUTION proposing to amend the Wyoming Constitution to allow local government entities to invest in stocks and equities upon a two-thirds vote of both houses of the legislature; and providing a ballot statement.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING, two-thirds of all the members of the two houses, voting separately, concurring therein:

Section 1. The following proposal to amend Wyoming Constitution, Article 16, Section 6 (a) (ii) by creating a new subparagraph (C) is proposed for submission to the electors of the State of Wyoming at the next general election for approval or rejection to become valid as a part of the Constitution if ratified by a majority of the electors at the election:

Article 16, Section 6. Loan of credit; donations prohibited; investment of funds; works of internal improvement.

(a) Neither the state nor any county, city, township, town, school district, or any other political subdivision, shall:

(i) Subscribe to or become the owner of the capital stock of any association or corporation, except that:

(C) The legislature may provide by law for the investment of county, city, township, town, school district, or any other political subdivision's funds in the capital stock of any association or corporation and may designate which of these funds may be invested. The legislature may prescribe different investment conditions for each type and class of political subdivision and for each type of fund. Any legislation establishing or increasing the percentage of any fund that may be invested under this subparagraph shall be passed only by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all the members of each of the two (2) houses voting separately.

Section 2. That the Secretary of State shall endorse the following statement on the proposed amendment:

The Wyoming Constitution allows the state to invest state funds in equities such as the stock of corporations, but does not allow the funds of counties, cities and other political subdivisions to be invested in equities. The adoption of this amendment would allow the funds of counties, cities and other political subdivisions to be invested in equities to the extent and in the manner the legislature may allow by law. Any law authorizing the investment of specified political subdivision funds in equities would require a two-thirds vote of both houses of the legislature.

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Section 2. That the Secretary of State shall endorse the following statement on the proposed amendment:

The Wyoming Constitution allows the state to invest state funds in equities such as the stock of corporations, but does not allow the funds of counties, cities and other political subdivisions to be invested in equities. The adoption of this amendment would allow the funds of counties, cities and other political subdivisions to be invested in equities to the extent and in the manner the legislature may allow by law. Any law authorizing the investment of specified political subdivision funds in equities would require a two-thirds vote of both houses of the legislature.
