Public Notice

Notification is hereby given to the public that the Town of Saratoga, Wyoming, has requested funding from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) for two proposed bank stabilization projects along the North Platte River. Project number one is near the Town of Saratoga Public Works facility located along S. River Street between E. Elm Avenue and E. Hickory Avenue. Project number two is located on Arrowhead Drive near the pedestrian bridge providing access to the Veterans Island recreational area. This notification is provided pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA), Executive Orders 11988 – Floodplain Management, and Executive Order 11990 – Wetland Protection, and Federal agency implementation procedures described in 44 C.F.R. Part 9 and Part 10. Funding from FEMA's Hazard Mitigation Grant Program will be

utilized. The purpose of FEMA's mitigation program is to implement cost-effective mitigation projects that will reduce the overall risk to populations and property. The intent of project number one is to protect the Public Works facility while project number two will protect the pedestrian bridge abutments, Arrowhead Drive and the water and sewer mains located within the road right-of-way.

Project number one involves the removal of the existing concrete construction debris for approximately 300 feet upstream of the Public Works facility on the western bank of the North Platte River. Then the existing riverbank will be excavated in the area adjacent to the Public Works facility to a 3:1 slope. Woven geotextile fabric will be installed over the length of slope. Riprap will be installed over the geotextile fabric in two 12 inch thick lifts over the entire length of the reduced riverbank slope. The project will also include planting native vegetation such

as Willows into the riprap to provide shading and cover for fish species. In addition, three twenty-five foot long barbs will be placed in the river.

Under project number two, the eastern riverbank of the North Platte River for approximately 400 feet upstream of the pedestrian bridge providing access to the Veterans Island recreational area will be armored. The project involves the removal of existing concrete rubble riprap. Then the existing riverbank will be reduced to a 3:1 slope. Woven geotextile fabric will be installed over the length of slope and then riprap will be placed. The project will also include planting native vegetation such as Willows into the riprap to provide shading and cover for fish species. For both projects, construction activities would be in accordance with all applicable federal, state and local laws, regulations and ordinances.

The President of the United States has issued Executive

Orders that require Federal Agencies to focus attention on the environment and on human health and safety when considering the funding of an action. Executive Order 11988 – Protection of Floodplains requires federal agencies to avoid to the extent possible the long and short-term adverse impacts associated with the occupancy and modification of floodplains and to avoid direct and indirect support of floodplain development wherever there is a practicable alternative. With this public notice, FEMA is informing the public that the proposed actions will occur in areas that are mapped within the 100-year floodplain. There are no practicable alternatives to the purposed projects and it is anticipated that long-term impacts to the floodplain will be beneficial, with potential minor, short-term impacts during the construction process. FEMA has also evaluated potential effects of the proposed projects on wetlands, endangered species and historic properties, and determined there will be no significant impacts to

these resources due to the proposed projects.

A public comment period for the proposed projects described in this notice will remain open for fifteen (15) days from date of publication. If no substantive comments are received, the proposed projects may proceed no sooner than fifteen (15) days after the comment period closes.
