# Keith is still with us

Over the about 26 years Keith McLendon lived in Saratoga, he always told us how wonderful the people in Wyoming were, especially Saratoga and Carbon County. The first time I drove to Saratoga with Barbara, we went to Veterans Island to help him celebrate his 30th birthday. Later, when we visited from Texas, he showed us the Community Center, the Hot Pool, the Saratoga Museum, the Platte River from a pizza place with Phil, and the abundant animals and majestic scenery. We stayed at the famed Wolf Hotel once and had a fine dinner there. We visited many local restaurants including the Whistle Pig that had good food, pool, interesting ceiling art and friendly people. Wherever we went, we met his friends and saw his unique, large, hand-carved signs. Another great love of Keith's was the Platte River. Floating on the Platte with Chilly and Keith are memories we will cherish forever. In early July this year, Keith showed us the wonders of the wider area like Devil's Tower, Mt. Rushmore and Crazy Horse with its extensive

Indian Museum. We learned more about the hard work Keith, Mike, Josh and Amanda were doing at the Saratoga Sun. He was so proud of his friends and coworkers and appreciative they had arranged to cover for him during our special family trip. We spoke of other towns that shined in the Platte Valley: Encampment, Medicine Bow, Elk Mountain, Riverside and Hanna. We made plans for a future trip to the Grand Encampment Museum. We went long ago, but Keith said it gets better every year and he was right! Keith's brother, Woody; niece, Morgan; stepfather, Paul; his girlfriend, Stephany; Keith and myself floated the Platte with Chilly to the Pic Bridge. There we took pictures of the girls jumping off the bridge. It was an amazing, wonderful trip I am so glad we had together. Our next visit to Saratoga and Rawlins at the end of July was strained. We had learned that Keith had died suddenly. I knew how alive Saratoga would make the town for me as he loved it so much. I was told of the meditation place

close to his house on Main St. I walked the Labyrinth that was copied from the original on the floor of the Charles Cathedral in France done about 1220. I walked the Labyrinth while Woody, Paul and Matt went into the house. It is very powerful for people with a loss in their lives. Thank you to the people who built it and maintain it. We somehow got through funeral arrangements in Rawlins with Jacoby Funeral Home. His obituary is listed there if you call or go online. Jon Nelson has been a great friend and wonderful neighbor to us and Keith. He helped with temporary care of Keith's cats as well as making the first visit to the house safer. He has aided us with the car and truck as well as other items that needed care. Jon helped with various parts of the Memorial Service at Veterans Island. Brenda and Susie helped getting the Veterans Island reserved for the memorial. The Sons of the American Legion and the Lions Club were so helpful with set up of the memorial and reception tables and chairs. Jim Beckmann brought and

set up his sound system for the memorial. Friends and family spoke about Keith. Donna spoke of young Keith. Elizabeth, Josh and Mike shared times at the Saratoga Sun. Paul and I said a few words. Rocky Michael Hagan, a missionary who had stayed with Keith in the past, reminded us that Jesus was a part of Keith's life and he had a good soul. People came up to me and my family before and after the memorial to tell stories about why they will miss Keith and how he had helped them. We received so many thoughtful beautiful cards. The Wyoming Press Association sent a beautiful bouquet of flowers. Keith was so proud of the many awards he had won for his work over the years with his team and with Elizabeth. Scott and Michelle McIlvain, good friends of Keith, generously provided platters of food for the reception. So many other Saratoga friends brought food and drinks to the Reception. Matt, his wife, Amanda and mother, Barbara Hagan, were so helpful with pictures,

a flower arrangement Keith would have liked and helping with many things. Josh, Mike and Amanda were so helpful as were the Sun's owners. Besides the many items in the paper about Keith, they held an Open House in the afternoon dedicated to what would have been Keith's tenth year with the Saratoga Sun that day. Later that night, we assembled on the Pic Bridge with Keith's aunts, Sharon Kay and Donna; and uncles, Jim and Shannon; brother, Woody; half-sister, Raychel; stepfather, Paul; Rocky Michael, Matt, Amanda, Barbara and myself to say a farewell to Keith by distributing Keith's and Phil's ashes in the Platte River and by placing a memorial flat stone decorated with his name and dates with mountains and rivers painted and sealed by my sister, Donna. Some of Keith and Phil's ashes were released, at Phil's earlier request, in the water draining from the Hot Pool into the Platte. Some of Keith's ashes were returned to his favorite places in Texas and to family members in other parts of the country.

Stephany adopted all 3 of Keith's cats, Patches, Grey and Mouse. Keith was so in love with Stephany and she made him so happy in the days they were together before he passed away. The Angelic Knitters sent me a warm and comforting shawl that I treasure. That the 24th Steinley Cup made shirts which commemorate Keith's life warmed our hearts and brought back memories. Keith designed their shirts for years. We have spoken about more permanent memorials like a flag in the area of Veterans Island, a bench at the Encampment Museum in front of the newspaper cabin, and/or a photo book of his carved signs at the Saratoga and Encampment Museums. We are working on them slowly as the family is scattered all over the United States from Florida to Oregon and from Kansas to Texas. Y'all have enriched our memories and comforted our broken hearts.
