




South Central Wyoming Emergency Medical Services

Dear Friends and Neighbors,

Season's Greetings from the members and staff of your ambulance service, South Central Wyoming EMS (SCWEMS). during this Holiday season, we want to wish you a safe and healthy holiday.

Founded in July 2009, SCWEMS is operated by a joint powers board with representatives from the towns of Saratoga, Encampment, Elk Mountain, Medicine Bow, Riverside and Carbon County. Funding to operate comes from the Carbon County Commissioners and fees charged for services from the participating towns. Services are provided within the town of Hanna through a service agreement.

Employees of SCWEMS are primarily volunteers with a small compensation when they are on call and ready to respond and when they actually respond to a call. SCWEMS has responded to nearly 1,600 calls from five stations in Elk Mountain, Medicine Bow, Encampment, Saratoga and Hanna.

To continue this life saving mission, we are seeking new dedicated volunteers who wish to help within their communities. We are in need of drivers, medical assistants and EMTs. Training will be provided for these levels of assistance. Nurses, P.A.s or any other healthcare professionals are also welcome. If you have the desire to better your community and can give as little as 48 hours a month of your time, we can use you.

A new EMT class will be starting in January and to SCWEMS employees there is no charge for this training.

If you have a desire to help save lives, contact one of the board members or get information from your town office.
