The regular meeting of the Board of Carbon County Commissioners (BOCC) commenced Tuesday, December 3, 2013 at the County Courthouse in Rawlins, Wyoming. Attending the meeting were; Chairman Leo Chapman; Vice Chairman John Espy; Commissioners Lindy Glode, Sue Jones and John Johnson.

Chairman Chapman called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE SARATOGA TOWN COUNCIL HELD DECEMBER 3, 2013, AT 6:00 P.M. IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBERS OF THE SARATOGA TOWN HALL

Mayor John Zeiger called the meeting to order.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Members present were Councilman Mike McWain, Councilman Steve Wilcoxson and Councilwoman Susan Howe, and Councilwoman Judy Welton.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA: Councilwoman Howe made a motion to approve the agenda as presented. Councilman Wilcoxson seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES: Councilman Wilcoxson made a motion to approve the minutes of the November 21, 2013 meeting as presented. Councilwoman Howe seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

APPROVAL OF THE BILLS: Councilwoman Welton read the following bills for approval: Accounts Payable: \$16,644.07; Payroll and FICA for 12/2/2013 in the amount of \$74,553.60; and manual checks (monthly liabilities) in the amount of \$46,943.84, for a total of \$138,141.51.

Councilwoman Welton made a motion to accept the resignation of Jaci Schwerdt from the garden board with regrets, seconded by Councilman Wilcoxson. The motion passed unanimously.

Councilwoman Welton requested that Clerk Cox send letters of appreciation to each board member noting the council's appreciation for their participation and efforts on the boards.

Mayor Zeiger read a letter of interest from Karl Smith asking the council consider his appointment to the Planning Commission.

Councilwoman Wilcoxson made a motion to appoint Karl Smith to the Planning Commission, seconded by Councilman McWain. The motion passed unanimously.
