The Saratoga-Encampment-Rawlins Conservation District, a political subdivision of the State of Wyoming, is requesting bids on the removal and installation of 2 fence projects in North Platte Valley. Each project will be considered separate and should be bid as such.

The Prospect Mountain Allotment 1 fence project will consist of removing approximately 1.15 miles +/- of existing fence and new fence construction

of approximately 1 mile. The fence will be a 3-wire wildlife friendly fence built to BLM specifications. Additionally 550 feet +/- post and rail top with woven wire fence enclosure will be constructed. All new material will be provided.

The Prospect Mountain Allotment 2 fence project will consist of removing approximately 2 miles +/- of existing fence and new fence construction. The fence will be 4-wire wildlife friendly fence built to BLM specifications. All new material will be provided.

# INSURANCE

## Disaster Fraud

Wyoming Insurance Commissioner Tom Glause reminds Wyoming residents that with the increase in seasonal hail storms, they should be cautious about possible disaster fraud. After a natural disaster, repair personnel often go from door-to-door in damaged neighborhoods, offering clean up or repair services. Many of these business people are reputable. Others are not. The dishonest ones may pocket payment without completing the job or use inferior materials and perform work not up to code.

Hiring a reputable contractor to do repairs is critical. Word of mouth is still one of the best ways to choose a contractor. Also check with the area Better Business Bureau (BBB). Make certain the contractors are licensed and have adequate insurance coverage. It is the homeowner's responsibility to hire and approve of a contractor during the repair process of an insurance claim.

**CONTRACTOR CHECKLIST:**

- **Get more than one estimate.** Don't be pushed into signing a contract right away.
- **Get everything in writing.** You will need details on the work to be done, materials, time schedule, guarantees, and cost.
- **Ask for a payment schedule.** Other expectations should be detailed and in writing.
- **Demand references** and check them out.
- **Ask to see the contractor's driver's license.** Write down the number along with the vehicle plate number.
- **Ask for proof of bonding/liability insurance.**
- **Ask for the contractor's business card.** It should have a verifiable street address and office phone number.
- **Never sign a contract with blanks.** Unacceptable terms could be added to incomplete forms.
- **Never pay a contractor in full** or sign a completion certificate until the work is finished.
- **Insurance coverage may be rendered void** if intentional misrepresentation by the policy holder is discovered.
- **If you believe you have been approached by an unlicensed contractor** or adjuster, or have been encouraged to fabricate an insurance claim, contact your insurance company or call the National Insurance Crime Bureau Hotline at: 1-800-835-6422.
