WHEREAS, since 1961, the Carbon County Volunteer Fire

Department has been functioning as a formal entity, and has been recognized as a formal entity by Carbon County, Wyoming;

WHEREAS, meeting minutes of the Board of Carbon County Commissioners, and meeting minutes of the Carbon County Volunteer Fire Department reference the formal existence and operation of the Carbon County Volunteer Fire Department, however the document or documents establishing the formal existence of the Carbon County Volunteer Fire Department have not been located;

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Carbon County, Wyoming, have determined that it is appropriate and within the powers of the Board of County Commissioners of Carbon County, Wyoming to reaffirm the formal existence of the Carbon County Volunteer Fire Department effective as of date, and to reaffirm that the Carbon County Volunteer Fire Department has operated continuously as a formal entity since that time.

CONSENT AGENDA

Commissioner Glode moved to approve the consent agenda. Commissioner Johnson seconded and Clerk Bartlett noted the consent agenda includes the September 15, 2015 regular meeting minutes; bond Continuation Certificate for Linda L. Crane, Treasurer for the Carbon County Visitors Council in the amount of \$100,000.00; bond for Daniel W. Izzo, Treasurer for the City of Rawlins in the amount of \$250,000.00; County Clerk receipts for \$21,598.00; Planning and Development Department receipts for \$665.00; and Clerk of District Court receipts for \$2,146.23. The motion carried unanimously.

Chairman Espy turned the meeting over to Vice Chairman Johnson and left the meeting at 9:07 a.m.

ELECTED OFFICIALS/ DEPARTMENT HEADS

Sheriff Commissioner Chapman joined the meeting at 9:18 a.m.

Commissioner Chapman moved to accept the quote from Stanley Security Solutions in the amount of \$19,750.00 to replace security cameras at the jail. Commissioner Glode seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

moved to hire William Wood Architecture for the Hugas Ferguson project contingent upon this company being licensed in Wyoming and to waive the procurement policy to do this. Commissioner Jones seconded and Commissioner Chapman confirmed there is no potential for the county to have to pay any outstanding invoices for Pahl Architecture or any of their associates and Ms. Bohanan agreed. Commissioner Chapman asked if Mr. Wood can use someone else's license if needed and Ms. Bohanan stated he could but prefers to get his own license timely. Commissioner Chapman also asked for lien wavier requirements in the contract and any other necessary safeguards. Clerk Bartlett asked how much the contract is for and Ms. Bohanan stated \$144,000.00 less the construction documents portion. Ms. Bohanan also suggested hiring a construction manager at risk for this project. Commissioner Johnson stated he has issue with the open ended nature of the construction documents portion of the project and suggested two separate contracts, one for architectural and one for construction documents. Clerk Bartlett re-read the motion and stated she is confused what the contract amount is and Ms. Bohanan was unsure but this would be in the contract once it is written. The motion carried unanimously.

Chairman Espy returned at 9:32 a.m.

Fire Commissioner Johnson moved to approve the recommendation of Fire Chief Rutherford to appoint Ron Brown as the Assistant Fire Warden and to take half of the Fire Warden salary and pay it to the Assistant Fire Warden and to authorize the Chairman to sign offers of employment to each outlining the salaries and terms of employment. Commissioner Chapman seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Jones moved to waive Seminole Boat Club's fireworks permit application fee. Commissioner Johnson seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Attorney Commissioner Johnson moved to approve a Memorandum of Understanding between The Town of Elk Mountain, Carbon County Board of Commissioners and Public Library Board of Carbon County continuing the May 4, 1982 lease expiring in 2032 and amends that lease only to the extent that the leased premises shall become the new and future library location at 109 Bridge Street. Commissioner Glode seconded and Commissioner Jones pointed out there is a process for budget amendments and if they run out of money they could take that route. Commissioner Chapman feels there should be some communication telling them that in spirit the county supports this move and that there will be associated costs that the county will support if able. The motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Chapman moved to request Clerk Bartlett draft a letter to the Library Board explaining budgetary options for the library move, noting the BOCC's support of the move and authorize the Chairman to sign a letter. Commissioner Johnson seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Glode moved to approve the Lease between Civeo USA LLC and Board of Carbon County Commissioners for the current footprint of two acres more/less through June 30, 2016 at Skyline Acres for \$1,200.00 per acre per month with the revenue going to Carbon County Economic Development Corporation contingent upon the BOCC's review and approval. Commissioner Chapman seconded and wanted to ensure that the conditions are not too strict for the individual to occupy the single unit. The motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Chapman moved to authorize the Chairman to send a comment letter concerning the Preliminary Environmental Assessment on the wild horse gathering noting this would be the same letter as previously sent. Commissioner Johnson seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Clerk Commissioner Chapman moved to approve the Contract Between the Wyoming Department of Health, Public Health Division and Carbon County for funding and oversight of the Com-

MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE SARATOGA TOWN COUNCIL HELD OCTOBER 06, 2015, AT 6:00 P.M. IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBERS OF THE SARATOGA TOWN HALL

Mayor Ed Glode called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Members present were Councilman Will Faust, Councilwoman Judy Welton, Councilwoman Susan Howe and Councilman Richard Raymer.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA: Councilwoman Welton made a motion to approve the agenda as presented. Councilwoman Howe seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES: Councilman Raymer made a motion to approve the minutes as presented. Councilman Faust seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

APPROVAL OF THE BILLS: Treasurer Flohr read the following bills for approval: Accounts Payable: \$79,276.77; Payroll and FICA for 9/22/15 in the amount of \$64,406.13; Payroll and FICA for 10/5/15 in the amount of \$54,612.98; and manual checks in the amount of \$50,024.34 for a total of \$248,320.22.

Councilwoman Welton made a motion to pay the Platte Valley Medical Clinic and Raymer Construction bills in the amount of \$842.64. Councilman Faust seconded and the motion carried. Councilman Raymer abstained.

Councilwoman Howe made a motion to pay the remainder of the bills in the amount of \$247,477.58. Councilman Raymer seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

CORRESPONDENCE: None

ITEMS FROM THE PUBLIC: Richard Hodges inquired as to how the income generated by the increased number of traffic fines is going to be used and suggested it be used to finish Tyler Pickett Park.

Leon Hetherington commented on the letter he sent to the Town of Saratoga addressing, in his opinion, the "town deer problem". Mr. Hetherington suggested that instead of passing a "fence ordinance" that the council pass an ordinance prohibiting people from feeding deer and that the town work through the Wyoming Game and Fish and harvest all the deer in town. Mr. Hetherington also stated that allowing homeowners to build fences that are not uniform will decrease the property values for everyone.

Mayor Glode reported that he had been in contact with Saratoga Game Warden, Biff Burton, regarding the deer issue.

REPORTS FROM DEPARTMENTS

Town Hall: Councilman Faust commented that the lack of daycare in Saratoga is a serious problem and parents of pre-schoolers face a real challenge to find someone to watch their kids so they can join the workforce.

Sarah Chatfield also added that there is a definite need for child care in Saratoga.

Councilman Faust recommended forming a small committee to identify the exact problem and look for a solution, including private and public funding options.

Fire Department: No report.

Police Department: Mayor Glode reported that they are looking at the police department vehicles and looking at options to replace the current fleet.

Recreation Department: Recreation Director Burton reported that there are some new classes being offered at the gym for fall and that the Recreation Department will be showing a Halloween Movie on October 29th at 5:30 p.m. following the Halloween Walk.

Director Burton also reported that there are floor dedication ceremonies scheduled for 2:30 p.m. and 6:30 p.m. on October 7th. The event scheduled at 2:30 p.m. will involve the students at SMHS and the 6:30 p.m. ceremony will be part of the Chamber Social scheduled at the gym. The floor at the PVCC gym was replaced in May with money acquired from numerous donors and is being dedicated to Kirsten Campbell. The public is invited to both dedications.

Public Works:

Street Department: Director of Public Works, Jon Winter, reported the Streets Department employees removed the boat dock at the lake, cleaned the heat exchangers for the sidewalks downtown; winterized sprinkler systems at the parks; completed fall maintenance at the swimming pool; installed a gate across the low water crossing on Veterans Island; performed vehicle maintenance; repaired the guard rail at the public library and installed steps and hand rails at Good Times Park.

Director Winter requested permission to purchase a snow plow for a pickup for \$7,001 installed and a tailgate sander with remote control for \$2,080 installed. Mr. Winter stated that purchasing another snow plow for a pickup will free up the big plows for use on the streets and bigger areas; and using the tailgate sander which, installs by way of a receiver hitch, will allow sanding in neighborhoods with steep streets and areas where the big trucks cannot operate. Both pieces of equipment will increase the efficiency in removing snow.

Councilman Faust made a motion to allow Director Winter to purchase a snow plow for a pickup for \$7,001 installed and a tailgate sander with remote control for \$2,080 installed. Councilwoman Welton seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Water & Sewer: Director of Public Works, Jon Winter, reported the Water Department employees shut water off at the parks prior to the systems being winterized, completed daily routine monitoring at the well field and lagoons; finished compliance monitoring and completed multiple line repairs and locates. Director Winter also reported that 5 employees attended the pipeline safety class in Rawlins on October 5th.

Director Winter requested permission to purchase a used Aries portable sewer camera unit in the amount of \$38,576. The package includes a Pathfinder tractor, camera, control unit, portable reel with approximately 900 feet of cable, locator receiver and carrying case and manhole guide. Mr. Winter indicated that the system would increase the efficiency of the public works department by reducing time spent locating existing service lines and taps and can be used to inspect and evaluate line/pipe conditions and locate blocked areas. In addition, it would eliminate the need to rent similar equipment to evaluate lines, which in the past has cost the town \$7,500 per week.

Councilwoman Welton made a motion to allow Public Works Director, Jon Winter, to purchase a used Aries portable sewer camera unit package which includes a Pathfinder tractor, camera, control unit, portable reel with approximately 900 feet of cable, locator receiver and carrying case and manhole guide for \$38,576. Councilman Faust seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Glode reported that there is money available in the water and sewer funds and will not come from the general fund.

Director Winter requested permission to hire Keith Harvey as a water department employee. Mr. Harvey has been interviewed and references checked. Mr. Harvey has extensive mechanical experience and will be an asset to the public works department.

Councilman Faust made a motion to allow Director Winter to hire Keith Harvey for the water department. Councilman Raymer seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Weed and Pest: No report given.

Hot Pool: Director Winter reported that steps and handrails have been installed by the hot pool building to make access from the upper parking area easier.

He also reported that one bid had been received to install top soil, the sprinkler system and sod at Good Times Park and they are currently seeking other bids for the project.

River Project: Director of Public Works, Jon Winter, reported that representatives from University of Wyoming will using ground penetrating

radar on Monday, October 26th.

Master Plan Steering Committee: Mayor Glode reported that the committee is seeking input by way of a survey. The link to the survey, which was designed by CBI, is located on the Chamber of Commerce website and the deadline to participate is Friday, October 9th.

Committee Chairman, Stacy Crimmins, reported that Kassey Westring had joined the committee and the next meeting will be held at 4 p.m. on Wednesday, October 21st at the Platte Valley Community Center and the survey results will be reviewed at that time.

Airport Board: Milo Hunter, a Boy Scout working to complete his Eagle Scout project, requested permission to install a sign at the airport, indicating that all requirements have been met with the Wyoming Department of Transportation.

Councilman Raymer made a motion to allow Milo Hunter to proceed with the installation of the sign and to allow the Mayor to sign the Landscaping Agreement with the Wyoming Department of Transportation. Councilwoman Howe seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

An agreement for the taxiway/taxilane project was discussed. The agreement allows for 20 working days from start to finish and will allow for one lane to be open at all times.

Councilwoman Welton made a motion to approve the agreement for the taxiway/taxilane project and allow the Mayor to sign. Councilman Faust seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

The next Airport Board meeting will be on October 14, 2015 at 1:00 p.m.

Community Center Joint Powers Board: Platte Valley Community Center Executive Director Joe Elder reported that the fundraiser held on September 19th was well attended and very successful, raising \$95,250 to be used to update and remodel the restrooms in the entryway of the gym. Depending on the cost estimates received, the project and fundraising may extend over two years.

Councilwoman Welton commended Mr. Elder and the fundraising committee for a well organized event.

Executive Director Elder also reported on the gym dedication ceremonies, stating that the dedications would highlight the partnerships between Carbon County School District #2, PVCC and the Town of Saratoga.

Saratoga/Platte Valley Chamber of Commerce Director Stacy Crimmins reported on upcoming events for the chamber, including the chamber board meeting on October 7th at noon; Halloween Walk on October 29th from 3:30 - 5 p.m.; Festival of Trees on December 4th and Christmas Parade December 5th.

The next meeting of the Community Center Joint Powers Board will be held Monday, October 12, 2015 at 4:30 p.m. Water and Sewer Joint Powers Board: Councilman Raymer reported that the board will be reviewing tap fees at the next meeting and will consider raising fees to a breakeven point.

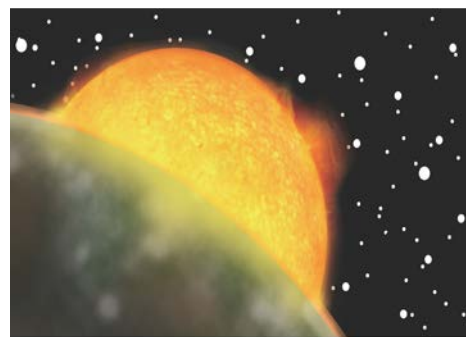
