**Public Notice Review** of Power Company of Wyoming LLC's request to Amend Permit DEQ/ISC 12-07 Wyoming Department of Environmental Quality, Wyoming **Industrial Siting** Council

the Industrial Siting Division received an amendment request on July 12, 2017 from Power Company of Wyoming LLC (Permittee). The Permittee is seeking approval to amend the bonding schedule for the Chokecherry and Sierra Madre Wind Energy Project in Carbon County. The request keeps the total bonding requirement at \$146,918,000 based on the decommissioning and reclamation costs which have not changed; however, the request amends the number is A1084615. bonding schedule allowing for six bonds instead ENVIRONMENTAL EFof three. The information submitted includes a letter describing the request, a revised Permit Condition 15, and updated tables breaking down the decommissioning and reclamation costs six proposed bonds.

Pursuant to Permit Condition #11, the Administrator is providing public notice of the requested change to permit DEQ/ ISC 12-07.
