A regular meeting of the Board of Carbon County Commissioners (BOCC) commenced Tuesday, August 3, 2021, at 9:00 a.m. at the Carbon County Courthouse in Rawlins, WY. Attending the meeting were Chairman, John Johnson, Vice Chairman, Sue Jones, John Espy, Travis Moore and Byron Barkhurst. Chairman Johnson called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

Commissioner Barkhurst seconded and stated that he feels the county is stuck as he would rather fix the bridge now but based on the cost and information, he feels the BROS program is the way

to go. The motion passed unanimously.

#### Clerk of District Court

Commissioner Jones moved to approve the Memorandum of Understanding between the Wyoming State Supreme Court and Carbon County for a Virtual Private Network (VPN) connection. Commissioner Espy seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Jones moved to approve Resolution No. 2021-29, Amendment Number 6 (Six) To Resolution 2013-12, A Resolution of The Board of County Commissioners, Carbon County Wyoming Setting Meeting Schedules to change the meeting date from September 21, 2021, to September 14, 2021, at the Platte Valley Community Center in Saratoga, WY. Commissioner Barkhurst seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

#### Attorney

Commissioner Moore moved to authorize the Chairman's signature on the service Agreement with Westlaw in the amount of \$832.34 per month for a term of 36 months. Commissioner Barkhurst seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Espy moved to authorize the Chairman's signature on the Agreement for Services with Cathedral Home for Children for a term of six months ending December 31, 2021, to provide diversion services. Commissioner Barkhurst seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Jones moved to approve the Certificate of State Grant-In-Aid for Dixon Airport's emergency beacon repair in the amount not to exceed \$10,800.00. Commissioner Moore seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Jones moved authorize the Chairman's signature on the Dixon Airport Grant Agreement for the purpose of funding costs related to operations, personnel, cleaning, sanitization, janitorial services, combating the spread of pathogens at the airport in the amount of \$22,000.00 with a termination date of 4-years from the date of acceptance. Commissioner Moore seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

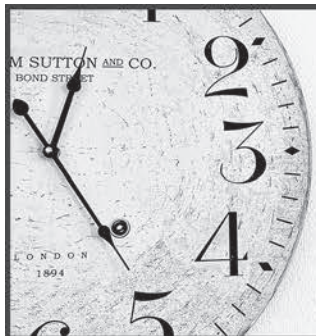

## SARATOGA TOWN COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING MINUTES AUGUST 3, 2021 AT 6:00 P.M. SARATOGA TOWN HALL COUNCIL CHAMBERS

Mayor Creed James called the meeting to order at 6:02 p.m. Members present were: Councilman Jon Nelson, Councilwoman D'Ron Campbell, Councilman Ron Hutchins and Councilman Spaulding on conference call.

### **APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA**

Councilwoman Campbell made the motion to accept the agenda. Councilman Hutchins seconded. Motion carried.

### **APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES**

Councilman Hutchins made the motion to approve the regular minutes on July 20, 2021. Councilwoman Campbell seconded. Motion carried.

### **APPROVAL OF THE BILLS**

Mayor James read the Accounts Payable, Payroll and Transmittal bills as follows:

Councilman Nelson made the motion to approve accounts payable for 8/3/21 in the amount of \$41,134.78. Councilman Hutchins seconded. Motion carried. Councilwoman Campbell made a motion to pay the net payroll for 7/22/2021 in the amount of \$37,959.76. Councilman Hutchins seconded; the motion carried.

Councilman Nelson made a motion to pay the 7/22/2021 transmittals in the amount of \$41,971.33. Councilwoman Campbell seconded; the motion carried.

### **CORRESPONDENCE**

• Kerry Irons - Transamerica Route through town - It currently goes down the state highway, would we like to change it or keep it the same? Councilman Nelson made the motion to keep the route the same. Councilwoman Campbell seconded. Motion carried.

• Platte Valley Arts Council - Stacy Crimmins - Letters of support for a public art project grant. Councilman Nelson made a motion to write a letter of support for the Platte Valley Arts Council. Councilwoman Campbell seconded. Motion Carried. Stacy Crimmins came to speak and said one location could be Tyler Pickett Park or the Hot Pool.

• Wyoming Community Gas - \$5,255.57 Distribution of Earnings

Mayor James said they would have to designate where donations would go to. Councilman Nelson stated the 2 fundraisers are Tyler Pickett Park and Woods Field. Mayor James said that maybe they table this or split the donation between the two projects. Councilman Nelson made a motion to table this. Councilwoman Campbell seconded. Motion carried.

• Carbon County Economic Development Corporation - Yvonne Johnson not present but will go to the next council meeting.

• Letter from Cindy Bloomquist - Impact from The Yard Cindy Bloomquist wrote a letter to The Council that Councilman Nelson read to all present. Councilman Nelson said he thought the event went well.

### **COUNCIL COMMENTS**

Mayor James stated that town hall is closed for precautionary reasons and will be closed until the end of the week and reopened by Monday.

### **ITEMS FROM THE PUBLIC**

• Special Events Permit - Girls Night Out 8/27/21

Chris Shannon stated that this is the 10th Girls Night Out event on Friday evening with 3 bands. Mayor James asked if they will be using the same parking plans as the last event. Chris said yes. Councilman Hutchins stated that the event went well. The council asked Chief Lehr if the last event went well and

he replied that it did except when they refused a police officer entry into the event. By law when an alcohol permit is used, a police officer needs entry to make sure

there is a safe environment for the public. Councilwoman Campbell made a motion to approve the special event, "A Girl's Night Out" with the same stipulations as the last event; Councilman Hutchins seconded. Motion carried.

• Malt Beverage Permits - Chris Shannon - Girls Night Out 8/27/21

Councilwoman Campbell made a motion to approve the malt beverage permit for "Girls Night Out" and Councilman Hutchins seconded. Motion carried.

• Mark Pesognelli - Platte Valley Healthcare Project-Jon Winters asked him to come talk to the council about the project and answer questions they may have. The hospital plans to reduce the dirt pile down in the next 15 days. He said the hospital is still on track and will be open by next August. Councilman Hutchins asked if the construction will continue through the winter and Mark Pesognelli said they are planning on it to make their deadline. Mayor James asked what their work schedule is because there has been heavy equipment starting at 5:30am. Mark said it is usually Monday - Thursday. Mark said that there were hot days so they started earlier than usual. Councilman Nelson stated that communication would be appreciated so that people would know if they were working outside working hours.

### **REPORTS FROM DEPARTMENTS**

#### **Town Hall:**

• Treasurer Position - There are 3 new applicants and maybe 1 more for the treasurer position. The Council is planning on interviewing the new applicants and will have a candidate by the next meeting.

• Planning & Zoning Enforcement Position - There were 2 applicants interviewed. There is one applicant they want to move forward with. Mayor James asked if there is any certain process for this position. Councilman Nelson it would just be a majority vote from the council. Mayor James will notify the other applicant that they will move forward with someone else. Councilwoman Campbell made a motion to hire the planning & zoning enforcement officer and Councilman Hutchins seconded. Motion carried.

• Councilman Hutchins made a motion to purchase the sneeze guard for \$2264.16 using the ARPA funds. Councilwoman Campbell seconded. Motion carried.

• Recreation Director - Mayor James read Lisa Burton's letter of resignation and her last day will be August 13th. Councilman Nelson made the motion to accept the resignation letter. Councilwoman Campbell seconded. Motion carried. Councilman Spaulding made a motion for the Saratoga Sun and Bigfoot Radio to advertise the recreation director position. Councilman Nelson seconded. Motion carried.

#### **Police Department:**

• The Chief said the police department is shorthanded. They cannot get police officers to come to Saratoga because there is no housing available. Chief Lehr also stated that Fentanyl is here in town and we need more officers to help police the community. The housing problem is a crisis because no officers have a place to live. Chief Lehr said they have vehicles that are going out and need new vehicles, especially for the police dog. Sergeant Brown spoke about the need for a new vehicle and the drug problem here in Saratoga. Mayor James asked for a workshop for these issues. The workshop will be scheduled for August 5, 2021 at 6pm.

#### **Fire Department:**

Mayor James reported that there have not been many calls. Recreation Department: Councilman Spaulding said the gym is closed because of covid. The Color Run is scheduled on August 21, 2021. There are 2 positions open on the Recreation Commission

and a letter has been received from Kathleen Beck for it. Councilwoman Campbell made a motion to put Kathy Beck on the Recreation Commission. Councilman Spaulding seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Baseball fields: The Council reached out to the Woods family and the Platte Valley Little League and will meet to talk about improvements to the baseball field on Monday August 9th at 7pm at the Saratoga Inn. The next Recreation Commission meeting is August 9th, at 5:30 in Town Hall.

#### **Department of Public Works:**

##### **Sewer and water:**

Councilman Nelson made the motion to purchase and increase the number of bottles for chlorine for \$7207.61. Councilwoman Campbell seconded. Motion carried. There is cyanobacteria at the lake and signs are posted around the lake about the danger. Councilman Nelson asked Director Winter if he asked WYDOT about crosswalks. WYDOT will study it again because they have to have a large number of traffic to have a crosswalk.

#### **REPORTS FROM BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS:**

##### **Community Center Joint Powers Board:**

Councilman Spaulding stated there is nothing new to report. The next meeting is on August 9th at 4:30pm at the PVCC.

##### **Water and Sewer Joint Powers Board:**

There is consensus with tap fees after the workshop with the Planning Commission. Councilman Nelson will draft it up and stated that there should be an impact fee based on number of lots in a subdivision or development and that will cover capital expansion costs.

The next meeting is on August 11, 2021 6pm at the PVCC.

##### **Planning Commission:**

No new updates. Next meeting is on August 10, 2021 at 5:30pm at Town Hall.

##### **Saratoga Airport Advisory Board:**

The project manager, Dave Schultz from Sage Engineering is conducting a preconstruction apron expansion meeting on August 11, 2021 at 1pm Town Hall. Councilwoman Campbell will be gone for an airport conference on September 7-10, 2021. Next meeting is on August 9, 2021 at 3:30pm at the PVCC.

**SCWEMS Board:** The next SCWEMS meeting is August 16, 2021 at 6:00p.m.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

Sergeant Brown said that there is a \$22,000 vehicle in Andover, Kansas ready to go with radio, lights, dog kennel, door popper, heat alarm for an SUV with 51,000 miles. Councilwoman Campbell made a motion purchase the used vehicle for \$22,000. Councilman Hutchins seconded. Motion carried.

#### **EXECUTIVE SESSION**

To discuss personnel and matters of litigation in accordance with W.S. 16-4-405(a)(ii) and (iii) Councilman Nelson made a motion to enter executive session at 8:10pm. Councilman Spaulding seconded; motion carried.

Councilman Nelson made a motion to exit executive session at 9:00pm and seal the minutes and note that no action was taken. Councilman Hutchins seconded; motion carried.

#### **ADJOURNMENT**

There being no additional business to come before the council, Councilman Nelson made a motion to adjourn at 9:01pm, Councilman Hutchins seconded, and the motion carried.

## INVITATION TO BID

Notice is hereby given that the Town of Saratoga (hereinafter called Buyer) will receive sealed Bids for Procurement for the **Saratoga Water Meter and AMI Replacement Project** in Saratoga, Wyoming, in accordance with the Bidding Documents. The Town of Saratoga Wyoming is soliciting bids for the procurement of cold-water meters, PRV's and associated metering components (electronic meter interface, cable, mobile transceiver) and a turnkey fixed base Advanced Meter Infrastructure (AMI) system including software, hardware, installation and training.

Bids will be received by the Buyer until **5:00 PM Local Time, on the 7th day of September 2021**, at Saratoga Town Hall, 110 E. Spring Ave, P.O. Box 486, Saratoga, WY 82331. Bids will be publicly opened.

The Buyer may reject any and all Bids and reserves the right to waive minor irregularities in any Bid.

Each Bid must be accompanied by a Bid Security payable to the Owner for 5% of the total amount of the Bid, to be forfeited to the Buyer as liquidated damages if the Bidder is awarded the Contract and fails to enter into an Agreement with the Buyer within thirty (30) days from his notification.

All Bids shall remain open for sixty (60) days after the day of the Bid opening.

The successful Bidder shall furnish the materials as specified and furnish Performance & Payment Bonds in the amount of 100% of the contract price with a corporate surety approved by the Buyer.

The Seller shall guarantee all materials and equipment furnished and work performed for a period of one year from the date of installation. The Performance Bond shall remain in full force and in effect through the guarantee period.

The Notice to Proceed may be issued within five (5) days of the contract execution for the procurement of the **Saratoga Water Meter and AMI Replacement Project**. If the Notice to Proceed has not been issued within a ninety (90) day period of the effective date of the Notice of Award or within any mutually acceptable extension thereof, the Seller or the Buyer may terminate the Agreement on written notice to the other party, and in such case, there shall be no liability under the Agreement or otherwise on the part of either party.

The contract for the project will be awarded to the lowest Bidder who has met the minimum requirements set forth in Section 3, Instructions to Bidders, Exhibit A of the Procurement Agreement and who is determined to be responsible in the

sole discretion of the governing body.

Pursuant to W.S. 16-6-106, "preference is hereby given to materials, supplies, agricultural products, equipment, machinery and provisions produced, manufactured, supplied or grown in Wyoming, quality being equal to articles offered by the competitors outside of the state".

A pre-bid conference will not be held for this project.
