Chicago Men Kill Big Bear

Two of the proudest lads in Chicago will be Geo. Holyoke and Dr. L. A. Stillman when they again plant their feet upon the pavements of their home city. Possibly they will be met at the station by a band and parade down State Street to the inspiring strains of the old hymn, "The Bear Went Over the Mountain," while they carry, conspicuously displayed, a magnificent trophy of their prowess as "Bwano Tumbos," the hide and head of a big Wyoming bear. The doctor may carry a banner inscribed, "WE killed a bear."

Inasmuch as Mr. Holyoke takes home the hide, he is willing that the doctor shall gather all the glory and consolation possible from the fact that he was with him.

Leaving out the frills, what really happened is this: While Mr. Holyoke

was lightly tripping over the peaks and crags of South Fork canyon, up above the Cascades (Dr. Stillman was with him) he suddenly spied a big, hairy object down in the canyon. While speculating upon its probable zoological classification, bruin discovered his discoverers and emitted a roar that restored the youth to our Chicago friends. Quickly pointing his rifle in the direction of the big noise, Mr. Holyoke pulled the trigger and then made a hasty retreat in the opposite direction (the doctor also ran). After due deliberation and seeing no evidence of further hostilities they cautiously retraced their steps and rejoiced to see bruin's lifeless remains lying upon the rocks. Holyoke proceeded to remove the hide and head (the doctor assisted) and brought it down to Peryam's ranch from whence, some days hence, it will be transported to Chicago.

The bear was a fine specimen, weighing about 350 pounds and was of a maltese color, probably a cross between a cinnamon and a silver tip.

Of course, one bear, more or less in a day's experience, is a matter of small moment to the native Wyomingite, but the successful capture of so fine a specimen by Chicago men whose knowledge of the species has been limited to the two-legged variety of the board of trade region is a fact justifies some elation.
