SARATOGA TOWN COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING MINUTES AUGUST 17, 2021 AT 6:00 P.M. SARATOGA TOWN HALL COUNCIL CHAMBERS

Mayor Creed James called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Members present were: Councilman Jon Nelson, Councilwoman D'Ron Campbell, Councilman Ron Hutchins and Councilman Spaulding on conference call.

APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

Councilwoman Campbell made the motion to accept the agenda. Councilman Hutchins seconded. Motion carried.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

Councilwoman Campbell made the motion to approve the regular minutes on July 20, 2021. Councilman Hutchins seconded. Motion carried.

APPROVAL OF THE BILLS

Mayor James read the Accounts Payable, Payroll and Transmittal bills as follows:

Councilman Spaulding made the motion to approve accounts payable for 8/17/21 in the amount of \$59,390.50. Councilman Nelson seconded. Motion carried.

Councilman Hutchins made a motion to pay the net payroll for 8/5/2021 in the amount of \$39,586.86. Councilwoman Campbell seconded; the motion carried.

Councilman Hutchins made a motion to pay the 8/13/2021 transmittals in the amount of \$16,797.25. Councilman Nelson seconded; the motion carried.

CORRESPONDENCE

• Carbon County Economic Development Corporation - Yvonne Johnson

Yvonne Johnson and Brandy Wallace came to speak. Councilman Nelson had reservations about investing with CCEDC because this community doesn't see a direct benefit from the corporation. Saratoga was an economic investor since 1983. Investment is based on population and Yvonne dropped our investment from \$5000 to \$500. Every municipality is an investor in the CCEDC, except for Saratoga. There is a big event on Friday with Governor Mark Gordon, the CEO of Rocky Mountain Power, and other important people will be there. Brandy serves on the board of directors of the CCEDC. Brandy Wallace spoke about how she sees economic development. Leadership Wyoming 2022 is \$350 and the group learns everything about Carbon County, industry, tourism, ag, education, nonprofit and government. Councilman Hutchins wanted more information about CCEDC. Clerk Marie Christen will provide more information to the council about CCEDC.

• WY Community Gas Donation for \$5,255.57 - Mayor James said that the little league will leave it up to the council regarding the donation. Councilman Nelson made the motion to divide the funds between Platte Valley Little League and Tyler Picket Park. Councilman Hutchins seconded. Motion carried.

• Carbon County Planning & Development Department- Whistle Pig Minor Subdivision CCPDD asked for any comments or suggestions regarding putting changes where Whistle Pig is. Mayor James asked if the council have questions to CCPDD before the deadline. Councilman Nelson said that Saratoga takes no issues with the proposed subdivision but asks the Council to take a comprehensive look at this corridor that all impacts to traffic and infrastructure are considered. Councilman Nelson made a motion and said he can pen something for the Mayor to sign and for the Town to send back to the CCPDD. Councilman Hutchins seconded. Motion carried.

COUNCIL COMMENTS

• Councilwoman Campbell spoke about our military over in Afghanistan and told everyone to reach out to those you know and said it has been a long process.

• Councilman Spaulding stated that it is important that everyone know how much the police officers are putting in to keep the community safe. He thanks the police department for the job they are doing with the limited staff they have.

ITEMS FROM THE PUBLIC

1) Octagon Estates - Final Plat for the first addition - Resolution 2021-01

Mayor James said the planning commission approved Octagon Estate's final plat as long as they resubmit their application that they have. Councilwoman Campbell made a motion to approve financial assurances to the town. Councilman Hutchins seconded. Motion carried. The final plat will be approved by resolution by the Council. Mayor James read Resolution 2021-01.

Councilman Hutchins made the motion to approve the Resolution 2021-01. Councilwoman Campbell seconded the resolution. Motion carried.

REPORTS FROM DEPARTMENTS

Town Hall:

• Treasurer Position - The council will discuss in executive session.

• Planning & Zoning Enforcement Position - The council will discuss in executive session.

• Rec Director Position - The council will interview 4 applicants.

• Holiday Pay & Vacation accrual from 160 to 240. There will be an amendment to the employee handbook. The vacation payout will be at the 160 hour limit and accrual can be up to 240. Councilwoman Campbell made the motion to change the vacation accrual limit to 240. Councilman Nelson seconded. Motion carried. Councilman Nelson made the motion to accept the language written by Attorney Jane France for holiday pay effective immediately. Councilman Hutchins seconded. Motion carried.

Police Department:

• Spoke to an applicant from El Paso County, Colorado. Housing is still an issue.

• Hot pool is still an issue for the police department. They are trying to keep it safe for the public.

• Councilman Nelson said if an opportunity presents itself, jump at the opportunity right away to sign a lease to hold for a future tenant. Mayor James said when something presents itself, the Council can hold a special meeting to sign a lease.

• Sergeant Brown asks the community to let the police department know about people with places to rent and know that police officers can not pay \$1800-\$2000/month to rent.

Fire Department:

Mayor James reported there was a red card refresher. There was a full red card class. The fire department is testing equipment. Training is every Wednesday night.

Recreation Department:

• Baseball Fields - The Platte Valley Little league will come up with a list to help reduce the amount of action items on the Woods family list.

• Pool - With Lisa Burton resigning, there is no staffing and the pool will need to be closed down.

• Gym, Weight Room & Aerobics Classes-in August, Monday-Friday the weight room will be at 5:30 in Town Hall.

Department of Public Works:

Sewer and water - Preconstruction meeting with Black Hills Energy and they are scheduled to start this week. Councilman Hutchins made a motion to approve paving not to exceed \$14,400 to repair.

Councilwoman Campbell seconded. Motion carried. Director Winter stated that he has interviewed a husband/wife team on cleaning the hobo pools. Councilwoman Campbell made a motion to hire the couple. Councilman Hutchins seconded. Motion carried.

REPORTS FROM BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS:

Community Center Joint Powers Board:

Councilman Spaulding stated there is nothing new to report. The next meeting is on September 13th at 4:30pm at the

PVCC.

Water and Sewer Joint Powers Board:

The board spoke about water loss. The next meeting is on September 8th, 2021 6pm at the PVCC.

Planning Commission:

1) Wind Song Development - The planning commission approved a plat contingent on council approving open space. The Town would like to accept fair market value for the space instead of dedicating a park because of the small area. The council will table this until Levi speaks to the Nikkel family. Councilwoman Campbell made a motion to table the plat. Councilman Nelson seconded the motion. Motion carried to table the plat. Next meeting is on September 14, 2021 at 5:30pm at Town Hall.

Saratoga Airport Advisory Board:

Next meeting is on August 9, 2021 at 3:30pm at the PVCC.

SCWEMS Board:

There is a bill from SCWEMS for the 1st quarter of ambulance services.

Councilman Nelson made a motion to approve the bill. Councilwoman Campbell seconded. Motion

carried. The next SCWEMS meeting is August 16, 2021 at 6:00p.m.

NEW BUSINESS

Mayor James asked if anyone reviewed year end fiscal reports. He asked if the Council should transfer money to reserves. The Council will table until the next council meeting. Councilman Nelson asked if the Council should wait until the audit is done. Auditors have a couple questions. The auditors are going to be reviewing the data and said missing data may have impact on us. Mayor James doesn't know when the fiscal year 2021 audit will be done but hopefully the 2020 audit will be done in the next few months. Councilwoman Campbell made the motion to table transferring money to reserves until they can review the numbers. Councilman Hutchins seconded. Motion carried. Councilman Nelson made an update on the pools. A nearby municipality pool operator can come over as soon as tomorrow. Councilman Nelson made a motion to get with Vivian Gonzales for the next 3 weeks, not to exceed \$500/week. Councilwoman Campbell seconded. Motion carried. The Council will cancel water aerobics class tomorrow morning and the council will have the attorney review the liability waiver and go from there.
