"Shall the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Carbon, State of Wyoming, be authorized to continue an excise tax within Carbon County, Wyoming for the purpose of general revenue at the rate of one percent (1%) upon retail sales and use of tangible person property and other transactions authorized by Section 39-15-201 et. Seq., Wyoming Statutes?"

TWO PERCENT (2%) COUNTY LODGING TAX QUESTION

VOTING ASSISTANCE

Any elector who requires assistance to vote because of blindness, disability or inability to read or write, may be given assistance by a person of the elector's choice, other than the elector's employer or an agent of that employer or an officer or agent of the elector's union (W.S. 22-13-113 (a)).

THE FOLLOWING ARE CAMPAIGN REPORTING REQUIREMENTS:

W.S. 22-25-108. Failure of candidate or committee to file statement. Candidates and committees shall be given notice prior to an election that failure to file, within the time required, a full and complete itemized statement of contributions and a statement of contributions and expenditures shall subject the candidate to civil penalties as provided in W.S. 22-25-108 (e). W.S. 22-25-109 Reporting candidates in violation. The secretary of state and the county clerks shall report the names of all candidates in violation of the Election Code of the state of Wyoming to the attorney general or to the district attorney, respectively, for appropriate action.
