### RECREATION DEPARTMENT

19) Treasurer Report

Treasurer Corina Daley stated we are looking good; we are getting more deposits coming in from impact funds than we projected. Interest in WYOSTAR is paying good, we are getting 4.25% in interest right now. Balances of each Wyostar account were stated. Each department's budget projections, revenues and expenditures were presented. There were no questions or concerns.

### POLICE DEPARTMENT

Chief Mike Morris stated there have been 131 calls of service since the last meeting. It has been a very busy time. Morris would like to acknowledge the staff of the police department for their time and dedication in keeping the public safe.

20) Powerphone Agreement with CCSO 1/3 \$34,971.75 Chief Morris tabled Powerphone until a later date.

### DISPATCH DISCUSSION

Chief Morris stated the Communication Center is at a crossroads. Going forward there are tough decisions to be made. It will take about \$500,000 to \$700,000 to update all equipment, and staffing is an issue. The department is down one fulltime dispatcher, we have 6 parttime dispatchers. The decision that needs to be made, buy new equipment and 5-7 years when it is outdated, buy again, or combine resources with CCSO. Short term we will be able to continue, long term it will not work. No matter what we choose, it needs to be sustainable.

Chief Morris met with members from the county, they gathered to discuss combining dispatch services. Chief Morris has invited members of the county to come discuss and answers questions. Sheriff Alex Bakken, County Commissioner Sue Jones, Encampment Fire Chief Corey Nuhn, Saratoga Fire Chief Pat Waliser, Encampment Chief of Police Kevin Shue.

Commissioner Sue Jones stated by statute County Commissioners have no say in what happens, they are strictly moral support and financial to the Carbon County Sheriff office. This decision will be between the Town of Saratoga and CCSO. Commissioner Jones recapped her time in dispatch, "It is a difficult job". The more we work together as a group, the better it is. This is a tough decision; she commends Chief Mike Morris for his hard work and courage in taking the steps to keep the community safe.

Sheriff Alex Bakken stated he has spent hours with Chief Mike Morris trying to figure out a resolution to this matter. What Saratoga is experiencing is not unique to Saratoga. Both CCSO and Rawlins Police Dept are down dispatchers. He does not see this as a failure, this is what he believes is the natural progression of dispatch facilities. We need to look not only at the present but 5-10 years down the road. Right now we are basically tripling cost to taxpayers by sustaining 3 dispatch centers. Bakken states he would rather combine now when they have the time, rather than it be under emergency circumstances. CCSO has the capability to dispatch for Saratoga tomorrow, it would not be perfect, but we could make it work. Mayor Chuck Davis stated he would like to see a firm number and see what it will be yearly to maintain. Davis stated that the Town of Saratoga needs to see why we are looking into this and be heard, this is not something that is going to be decided in the next couple council meetings.

Chief Mike Morris states right now thinking this through, the best solution is to combine. Councilman Mike Cooley stated it is our job to do the best for our community. Mayor Davis asked for the opinions from members of the surrounding emergency agencies. Chief Pat

Waliser, hard to give up the center, if we don't have the updated equipment, or staff you don't have a dispatch center. Chief Kevin Shue just received equipment to be able to communicate with CCSO. Hate to see it go to Rawlins, but it seems to be what is best. Dispatchers in Saratoga are worn out.

Commissioner Sue Jones, wanted to make it clear "This is Carbon County not Rawlins. We need to come together as Carbon County residents. Chief Morris agreed this is entities coming together for the good of the people, not a takeover. This is not something that he has taken lightly, just believes this is the thing to do.

### FIRE DEPARTMENT

Chief Pat Waliser reports Engine 13 will cost about \$12,000 to get truck fixed, we need to get the truck fixed and back in town. AC unit is in, there is no rush in getting it installed right now.

Notice is hereby given that the Town of Saratoga, (hereinafter called Owner) will receive and accept bids only through QuestCDN.com via their electronic VirtuBid online bid service until 1:30 P.M. Local Time March 20, 2024 for the South River Street Waterline Replacement, Saratoga, Wyoming, in accordance with the Bidding Documents.

A public bid opening will be held at the Saratoga Town Hall, 110 E. Spring Ave., Saratoga, Wyoming, 82331. Bids will be publicly opened and read aloud at the stated date and time above.

The project consists of:

Furnishing and installing approximately 2450 lineal feet of 4", 6" and 12" water main, gate valves, fittings, appurtenances, 40 lineal feet of 20" directional drill, 13 water services including new curb stops and connections to existing meter pits, 5 fire hydrants, various surfacing restoration throughout and an additive alternate for a chip seal.

Each Bid must be accompanied by Bid Security payable to the Owner for 5% of the total amount of the Bid, to be forfeited to the Owner as liquidated damages if the Bidder is awarded the Contract and fails to enter into an Agreement with the Owner within thirty (30) days from notification. The Owner may reject any and all Bids and reserves the right to waive minor irregularities in any Bid. Bids shall remain open for forty-five (45) days after the day of Bid opening.

The successful Bidder shall perform work and furnish a Performance Bond and Payment Bond, each in the amount of 100% of the Contract price with a corporate surety approved by the Owner. The Contractor shall guarantee all materials, equipment furnished and work performed for a period of one year from the date of final acceptance; additionally, the Contractor shall guarantee all trench compaction for a period of two years from the date of final acceptance. The Performance Bond shall remain in full force and in effect through the guarantee period. The Notice to Proceed shall be issued within thirty (30) days of the execution of the Agreement by the Owner. If the Notice to Proceed is not issued within this period, this period may be extended by mutual agreement between the Owner and the Contractor. If the Notice to Proceed has not been issued within the thirty (30) day period or within any mutually acceptable extension thereof, the Contractor or the Owner may terminate the Agreement on

written notice to the other party, and in such case, there shall be no liability under the Agreement or otherwise on the part of either party.

The Contract will be awarded to the lowest Bidder who has met the minimum requirements set forth in Article 3, Instructions to Bidders, and who is determined to be responsible in the sole discretion of the governing body.

The Contract shall be let to the responsible certified resident making the lowest bid, if the certified resident's bid is not more than five percent (5%) higher than that of the lowest responsible nonresident bidder and the resident bidder does not propose to subcontract more than thirty percent (30%) of the work to nonresident contractors. Resident Wyoming laborers, workmen and mechanics shall be used upon all work in this contract whenever possible.

Clerk Bartlett noted the consent agenda includes the January 2, 2024, regular meeting minutes; monthly receipts from Clerk of District Court in the amount of \$5,394.00 and Carbon County Clerk in the amount of \$15,520.25, bonds for Alethea Foster, Clerk/Treasurer for the Town of Baggs in the amount of \$50,000.00, Randy Arnold, Treasurer for Saratoga, Encampment Rawlins Conservation District in the amount of \$100,000.00 and Garrett Irene, Carbon County Commissioner in the amount of \$10,000.00, Meghan O. Lally, Treasurer for Little Snake River Conservation District in the amount of \$10,000.00 and Notice of Valuation Changes in the amount of (\$1,721.00). Vice Chairman Moore seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

### ELECTED OFFICIALS & DEPARTMENT HEADS

#### Road & Bridge

Commissioner Espy moved to approve the Chairman's signature on the Participating Agreement between the County of Carbon and the USDA, Forest Service Medicine Bow-Route National Forests and Thunder Basin National Grassland for the purpose of documenting the cooperation between the parties to apply Mag Chloride on County Road 401 with the US Forest Service reimbursing Carbon County for their share of the expenses in the amount of \$155,326.00. Vice Chairman Moore seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Johnson moved to approve the Chairman's signature on the letter to the WY Department of Transportation formally requesting the replacement of a bridge on County Road 680 for the BROS program. Vice Chairman Moore seconded and Mr. Fritz reported there are two bridges on County Road 3 that need looked at for future replacement and the replacements should be planned well in advance. She has had issues with obtaining an engineer to sign off on new decking and she stated this is a proactive approach and will take likely a decade to get replaced through the BROS program. Commissioner Johnson thought the road should be improved before the bridge is replaced. Commissioner Espy reiterated the BROS program is slow and asked what re-decking would cost and Mr. Fritz stated that she must have engineered specifications for decking and she cannot find an engineer to provide that work. Chairman Jones discussed options of finding an engineer. Commissioner Johnson said the deck is failing but if enrolled in the BROS program and it's not touched for 10 years and he thinks the deck needs replaced sooner. Ms. Fritz read from the WYDOT bridge inspection report of work that she had already done and that she could do to distribute weight more evenly. Vice Chairman Moore questioned what happens with bridge maintenance during the decade the county waits for the BROS program. Ms. Fritz clarified that the county would install steel plate decking and monitor the bridge with WYDOT while the county waits for the replacement. Commissioner Espy said he would like to see the bridge on the list for any potential catastrophic failure while the county continues to maintain the interim. Commissioner Johnson disagreed as the traffic is extremely low. Kandis estimates this to be a \$2 million bridge replacement versus approximately \$600,000 for the county's portion if on the BROS list and she would rather let BROS handle the larger bridges and the county would replace smaller bridges on its own. Commissioner Irene discussed the Elk Mountain bridge that got replaced and that residents didn't want the historic bridge to be removed but, in the end, it was a good project for safety. He feels we should re-deck when needed and put it in the program with a final decision later, putting it on the list for the future. Commissioner Johnson said once the bridge is on the BROS program and the county were to pull it off the county would be responsible to reimburse the program for costs involved. Commissioner Espy said the state essentially shut down the Alcova bridge in Natrona County and he doesn't want to be in that situation in the future therefore he will support Ms. Fritz recommendations. Commissioner Johnson stated the

Natrona County bridge and the Elk Mountain bridge comparisons aren't true comparisons due to the smaller traffic counts on CR3. The motion died with only Commissioner Johnson and Chairman Jones voting for the motion and the remaining commissioners voting against.

Vice Chairman Moore moved to authorize the Chairman's signature on a letter to the WY Department of Transportation formally requesting the replacement of two historic bridges located on County Road 680, Bridge over Encampment River (DMT) and located at mile post 1.10 and on County Road 3, Bridge over Medicine Bow River (DNC) and located at mile post 7.10. Commissioner Espy seconded and Commissioner Irene agreed there isn't as much traffic but he feels this is a safety issue. The motion passed with all voting for the motion except Chairman Jones and Commissioner Johnson who voted against.

### Building and Grounds

Commissioner Espy moved to approve the Chairman's signature on the Contract for Services with Wyoming Apparatus, LLC for generator repair at the Carbon County Jail and in the amount of 12,202.28. Commissioner Irene seconded and Commissioner Moore wanted to know what a replacement would cost in comparison to this replacement. Mr. Askins estimated hundreds of thousands. The motion passed unanimously.

### Planning and Development

Commissioner Irene moved to accept the Certification of Recommended Action from the Carbon County Planning & Zoning Commission for Z. C. Case #2024-01 - Zoran and Vesna Vrhovnik and schedule a public hearing for Tuesday, February 20, 2024, at 11:30 a.m. at the Carbon Building - Courthouse Annex in Rawlins, Wyoming. Commissioner Johnson seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

### Clerk

Vice Chairman Moore moved to award the grant administration services and Community Prevention Specialist Services to Carbon County Public Health for the Community Prevention Grant for the period of July 2024 through June 2026. Commissioner Espy seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Johnson moved to reappoint Judy Dixon to the Urban Systems Committee for a 4-year term ending January 2028. Vice Chairman Moore seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Espy moved to authorize the chairman's signature on the 2024 Wellness Contract for Carbon County Employees with Wyoming Health Fairs dedicating what blood tests the county will pay for through May 2024. Commissioner Irene seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Johnson moved to authorize the Chairman's signature on two Group Reopening Requests with Blue Cross Blue Shield to add Knova Solutions fee dating back to October 2023. Vice Chairman Moore seconded and the motion passed unanimously.
